






Tech Tips

How to Replace your Lock Pillar Filler and Leading Edge Seals

A worn-out lock pillar filler and leading edge not only look bad but could also be responsible for the whistling noise caused by wind and gives water a way to get into your vehicle.




The lock pillar fillers are found on the inside of the doors. A door lock pillar seal, or U jamb seal, is the rubber part found where the rear quarter window meets the lock pillar. It serves as the access manager for the quarter window seals and a good lock pillar filler has a metal core that holds the screws in place and keeps the part sturdy. Without this piece water and dust will accumulate in the quarter panel; elements that will eventually lead to rust.

The leading edge is found on the quarter window where it meets up with the door window when the door is shut.


The leading edge, or quarter window leading edge, seals the rear quarter window to the side window when it is rolled-up and the door is closed.

Replacing these parts is easy and can be done at home with only a screwdriver and a bottle of soapy water.

It is best to change the seals on both doors at the same time since they will probably both be equally worn. These parts are almost always sold



in pairs so this also saves you from searching for individual parts later. The fillers go by other names including lock pillar seals or just filler seals. The quarter window seals are also called leading edge.

2 Person Thunderbird Predecessor?




It was late in the 1940's when the Nash-Kelvinator Corp looked at producing a two-seater sports car, much like its English competitors. This generated to a joint work by Nash CEO George Mason and English Racing king, Donald Healey. These two met on the RMS Queen Elizabeth amid their shared interest in photography. The result was the first two-seater sports car offered by an American company. It was offered with coupe and soft top versions plus a 3-speed transmission with overdrive and disc brakes all around. The pair souped up a Nash V8 engine and designed a new body. The manufacturing process was elaborate with Nash shipping engines to England which were then placed in Healey assembled bodies. The initial marketing campaign included giving the first one to singing star Petula Clark.




Tech Tips

RADIO FACE PLATE by Scott Mc Gilvray Photos by Tim Chaput

A lot of T-Birders would like to improve the appearance of their heater face plate (#18550) but are apprehensive about removing it from the dash. This method allows removal of the face without disturbing the control lines attached to the back. Don't get me wrong it's still not easy but it is well worth the effort. Looking at the assembly from the rear you see that there are two bolts holding the mounting clips in place. Remove these two bolts and two more bolt heads appear behind them. These two bolts (screws in some cases) hold the face to the housing.



The knobs come off first by removing these two bolts this allows the face assembly to be removed from the front. The chrome face is bradded to the bulb holder portion of the housing. File down or carefully grind off the nubs of the peened over pins that hold the face to the housing, at the four corners.

Notice that there is a brass plate backing up the plastic lens, this defuses the light so don't throw it away. It is now time for re-assembly and this is the same whether or not you are using the original face plate cleaned and polished, a new chrome face plate or a re-chromed face plate. Trial fit the bulb holder housing to the face plate. See how far the tabs go down over the mounting pins. The face plates are designed to be peened over in place. Some face plates may do this well but I don't trust any of them. When drawing up the mounting bolts and clips it puts pressure on the face and they often come apart. To insure a strong connection the four posts should be drilled, taped and screwed together. Drill down into the center of the pins no more than 5/16 of an inch maximum. The proper drill bit is a #43 (.089") drill. Using a bottom tap, tap the holes with a #4-40 tap. Tap should be available separately from a good hardware store, no need to buy a whole set unless you don't have or can't improvise a tap handle. Editor's note: A good hobby store that carries HO or N gauge trains will carry the screws, drills and taps.

The screws are number 4's so the tap is a #4-40. Meaning it's a number 4 screw with 40 threads per inch. The shortest screws I could find were 1/4" in length and they were still too long, cut them off with a screw cutter part of your wire stripper. Editor's note: If the plastic face plate is scratched, it would be a good time to invest in a new plastic heater face plate #18619. You can pick up a new one from many of the parts houses for about \$12.00.



"Have you ever wondered what the difference is between Grandmothers and Grandfathers? Well, here it is:



A gas station on Brovarsky Prospect in Kyiv, Ukraine, 1979




Philadelphia Electric Co. street light maintenance vehicle, 1910


