

POWER SEAT MODIFICATION

This tech tip is complements of Peter Leddy who was working on a power seat while I stopped by.

Some owners need more leg room than their power seat is capable of giving. By performing the following modification you can add an additional inch plus is achievable. If you don't think an inch is significant try moving the seat in your family car an inch out of its normal position and see.



Picture #1 is of the seat frame out of the car and turned over. The two bolts in the middle of the track hold the seat to the frame.



Picture #2 shows the rear bolt removed. Just rearward of these two bolt heads is a "nub" that is the stop for the ball bearing over which the seat moves. This "nub" needs to be flattened. If it is just cut off the resulting hole will not let the ball pass. Use a punch to knock the "nub" nearly flat and use a file, grinder or Dremel tool to smooth it down. The ball will now stop at the head of the first bolt when it is reinstalled in the track. An additional eighth of an inch can be gained by cutting the rear part of the bolt head away. Remember to do both sides and your passenger will always be ahead of you.

If you didn't do it when the car was restored clean and lube the tracks to insure smooth operation. Also sight down the tracks to see if a previous owner's weight has bent the tracks.



Picture 3 shows stock travel of the seat and Picture 5 shows a second hole drilled in the floor bracket so the seat has the range it needs. This second hole may not be necessary but why take a chance, it's a lot of work to do it later.




This procedure is only good on 4 way seats. Dial-O-Matic seats are limited by their motors and theoretically would stop where they always did, but in a worst case scenario this modification could harm the motor.

Hood Ground Clip improves radio reception

Anti static clip for 1955 and 1956 Thunderbirds that is attached to the hood pad on the cowl. Most 1957's did not have this clip and when they did. It was smaller (more narrow).



Automobile Info Cat 994K Wheel Loader

This machine is required to move 500 tons of earth/ore which will be refined into one lithium car battery. It burns 900-1000 gallons of fuel in a 12 hour shift. Lithium is refined from ore using sulfuric acid. The proposed lithium mine at Thacker Pass is estimated to require up to 75 semi loads of sulfuric acid a day. 

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Automobile Info What Was the Final US-Market Car to Get a 3-Speed Automatic?

In these days of the gear-count arms race, it's hard to imagine a mere three forward gears.

Now that we're up to ten forward speeds in ordinary street automatic transmissions, the idea of a *three*-speed automatic seems amusingly antiquated. The good old three-speed slushbox was a mainstay of the transmission world for many decades and it remained an option for car shoppers here until our current century.

The very first truly successful automatic car transmission actually had four forward speeds, becoming available starting with the 1940 Oldsmobile. The original Hydramatic proved very reliable, and still shines on a road-racing course today. GM also scored a smash hit with the two-speed Powerglide automatic during the 1950s and 1960s, but the three-speed dominated the North American automatic world from the 1960s through the early 1980s. The need for a fuel-saving overdrive high gear coupled with not-too-jarring shifts put the squeeze on three-speeds during the latter decades of the 20th century, but you could still get one in a new car here as late as— believe it or not— the 2002 model year.

If you insisted on a bulletproof, old-school three-speed automatic in your 2002 new car, you had just two choices: the Toyota Corolla CE or the Corolla rebadged to Chevrolet Prizm. Chrysler's final three-speed-equipped North American Neons and Caravans were 2001s, and that was the last year for three-speed Chevy Cavaliers and Metros as well.






Just about everyone else had abandoned the three-speed automatic in American-market cars before the end of the 1990s (such is most definitely not the case with *trucks* sold here).


