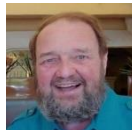

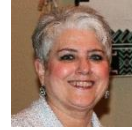

INCLINE DRIVEWAYS

Our T-Birds have a neat looking front hinged hood. However, if you parked headed up on an incline driveway to wash or work on your Bird, be careful when having the hood open. When drying that last drip of water running down the open hood, it does not take much pressure to cause it to slam shut. This is especially true if the hinge springs have weakened. If this does happen it is best to let it close, then reopen it instead of trying to stop it and risk catching you fingers between it and the fender. The same is true should someone accidentally bump the open hood while you are working on the engine. In either case it would be safer to back up the incline

A: A 1909 White Steamer, ordered by President Taft.



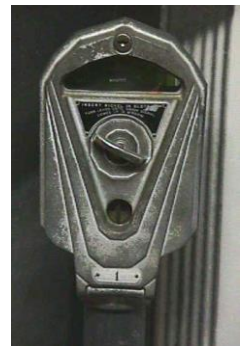

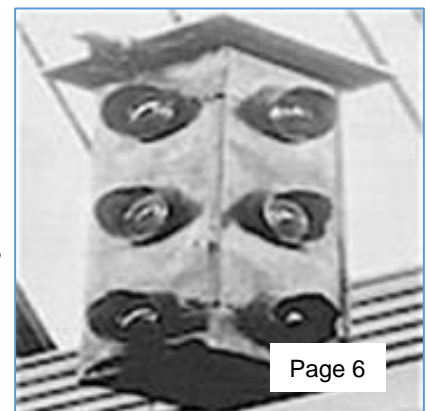

Bird Engineering Ford Thunderbird-Style Go Kart



This go-kart was built in the style of a first-generation Ford Thunderbird by Bird Engineering of Elkhorn, Nebraska, in the 1980s. It is said to have remained with the family of the original owner before it was purchased by the seller in 2019. The kart features red fiberglass bodywork over a tubular steel chassis, and power is sent to the rear axle via a three-horsepower Briggs & Stratton single. Features include gray-painted headlight buckets and bumpers, faux fender vents, a three-spoke steering wheel, a steering column-mounted ignition switch, and a seat trimmed in black vinyl.

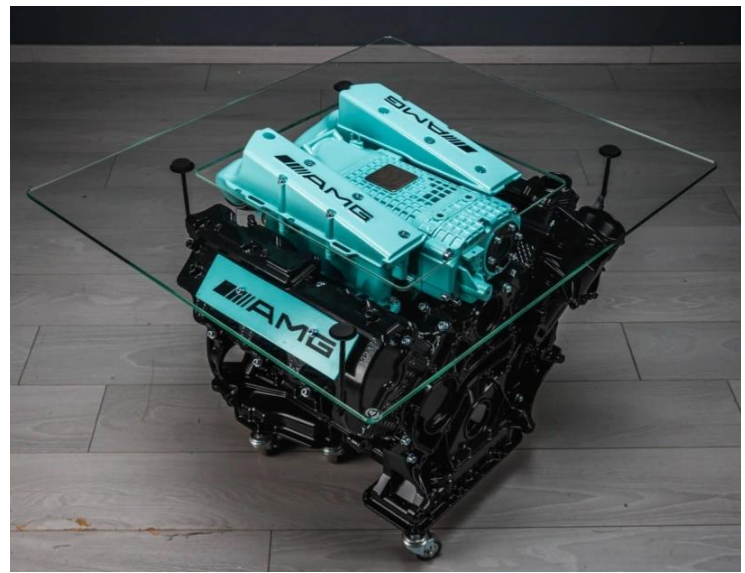

Classic Car Collector Coffee Table

The glass is supported by four metal posts, and the intake plenum and supercharger rise above the tabletop through a cutout center section. This Mercedes-Benz coffee table is now offered at no reserve in Carmel Highlands, California. The engine features a block, cylinder heads, and valve covers finished in black as well as a teal-finished supercharger, intake plenum, and valve cover plates.

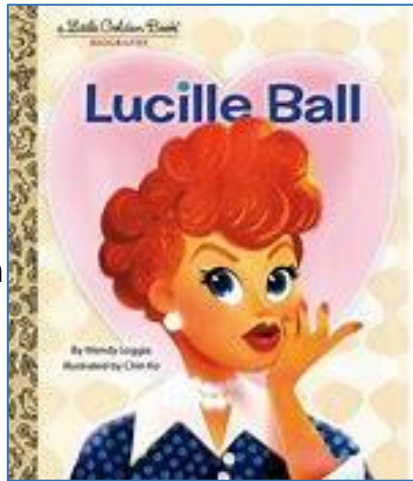

THE NEW DARWIN AWARDS ARE HERE!!
