





Bad Battery Connections

Are you plagued by bad battery cable connections? The connection with the real trouble is the negative cable, which connects the negative battery terminal to the firewall of a '57 T-Bird. This connection usually grows something often called 'Hair.' Different remedies have been tried: There is the felt washers sold at auto parts stores, also sprays to stop the 'Hair' growth, washing the battery terminal down with Coke, and removing the cable entirely and taking it to the wire wheel. None of these are a long-term fix.

A suggested solution is Dielectric Grease. First remove the negative cable from the battery and the firewall, for '57's. 1955 and '56, this ground cable connects to the engine. Then use a wire wheel to remove every bit of 'Hair'. It might be best to start with a new cable as an alternative' Spread the dielectric grease on the terminal, all the way down to the top of the battery case. Then spread the grease on the inside and outside of the battery cable connector, making sure to push some into the bolt threads. Wipe excess grease off the battery terminal before reinstalling the cable. If you do this, be sure to try to start the car.

If it does not start, then you still have too much grease between the terminal and the connector. Remove this and wipe down both lightly. Reconnect and try again.





Draining

- With the vehicle in PARK, position it on a hoist. Set the vehicle as close to level as Adapter, Fluid Level and Fill possible. For additional information, refer to Plug Section 100-00.307-437
- 2. Remove the drain plug (large plug) and allow the fluid to drain.




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

Filling


1. Install the fluid drain plug.



2. Hold the larger drain plug with a wrench and remove the small (center) fluid level indicating plug.




3. Install the special tool into the pan.




4. NOTE: Prior to filling the special tool with clean transmission fluid, make sure that the canister is clean.

Fill the special tool with clean automatić a transmission fluid.




5. Hang the special tool under the vehicle, upright and close to the transmission.



6. Connect the special tools.


Connect the open end of the fluid hose from, the Fluid Transporter/Evacuator/Injector to the Adapter, Fluid Level and Fill Plug at the bottom of the transmission fluid pan.



7. Apply a maximum of 206.85 kPa (30 psi) to


the open end of the vacuum/pressure hose from the special tool. Fluid will immediately start flowing out of the special tool into the transmission fluid pan.




- 8. Add two or three quarts of transmission fluid into the fluid pan. Stop the process by releasing the air pressure and removing the air nozzle from the end of the hose.
- 9. NOTE: Engine idle speed is approximately 650 rpm.

Start and run the engine until the transmission fluid temperature is between 27°C - 49°C (80°F - 120°F).


- 10. Inspect the fluid level in the special tool. If the fluid drains back into the canister, the transmission is full. If no fluid drains back more fluid will need to be added. Repeat steps 9 & 10.
- 11. Once the transmission is full, place a hand vacuum pump on the open end of the vacuum/pressure hose of the special tool and apply vacuum to the system. This will pull out any extra fluid trapped in the system and direct it into the container.



12. Allow the fluid to drain. When the fluid comes out as a thin stream or drip, the fluid is at the correct level.



13. Reinstall the small (center) fluid level indicating plug using a 3/16-inch Allen key.

A New Version of the Ford Thunderbird Looks Ready

Ford built the first Thunderbird starting with its model year 1955 debut through 1997. The Thunderbird then went on a five-year hiatus, returning to its roots in 2002 with a two-seater convertible design. The eleventh generation T-bird would run through 2006 until again getting discontinued by the blue oval.

Ford has not indicated they'll revive the Thunderbird for a future generation, but that doesn't stop the enthusiasm for the car from remaining strong. Rostislav Prokop's rendering shown here is both a tribute to the original and a bold redesign that incorporates modern styling. The hardtop roof stays true to form complete with the small circular windows behind the driver and passenger side doors. The headlights and taillights on the new version are more boldly styled with an overstated halo-light look more closely aligned with modern cars. Black wheels, a gunmetal gray pain scheme, and sharp lines take a famous personal luxury car design and incorporate modern muscle.

Cars like the current Dodge Challenger similarly nod to the past while keeping in touch with the taste of consumers who want power and good looks in 2024. Thunderbird specific badging and yellow brake calipers finish off the change as a modern coupe.

While there aren't plans made public by Ford to revive the Thunderbird nameplate, never say never. The Blue Oval discontinued and revived the Thunderbird once before. Since sales of the 2002 version didn't quite meet expectations, a different execution could change the car's long-term fate.





Four Wheeled Works for Art?

Even before it was immortalized on the big screen, the 1967 Ford Mustang GTA Fastback was already the epitome of macho cool. In its first major update since the Mustang hit the market, the '67 took on a more modern and muscular look, becoming longer and wider in the process.

Type 59 was the car manufacturer's last Grand Prix racer, and was the last one founder Ettore Bugatti built before his demise. With its long, slender body, "piano wire" wheels and other intricate design figures, the Type 59 is a piece of art on wheels. Other owners of this car have included King Leopold III of Belgium.

The most ravishing model of Mercedes-Benz' 500 series is its two-seater Mercedes-Benz 500K Special Roadster, launched in 1936. A limited production cabriolet, fewer than 30 were made, adding to its near-mythical qualities. In its day it went for top dollar — over \$106,000.







THE NEW DARWIN AWARDS ARE HERE!!

The Darwin Awards are finally out. The annual honor given to the persons who did the gene pool the biggest service by killing themselves in the most extraordinarily stupid way. Semifinalist #5

Upon entering the building, they found they had
